Introduction

Halo Nation Training Pty Ltd is a Registered Training Organisation (RTO number 32485) registered with the Australian Skills Quality Authority. Halo Nation Training is proud to offer training in TLILIC0040 Licence to operate a non-slewing mobile crane (greater than 3tonnes capacity)

Course Description

This unit specifies the skills and knowledge required to operate a non-slewing mobile crane with a Maximum Rated Capacity (MRC) exceeding 3 tonnes safely, in accordance with all relevant legislative responsibilities. Competence in this unit, does not in itself result in a HRWL licence to operate this plant. Non-slewing mobile crane means a mobile crane incorporating a boom or jib that cannot be slewed, and includes:

- an articulated mobile crane
- a locomotive crane
- but does not include vehicle tow trucks.

A person performing this work is required to hold a non-slewing mobile crane HRWL. This unit requires a person operating non-slewing mobile crane with an MRC exceeding 3 tonnes to:

- plan the work/task
- prepare for the work/task
- perform work/task
- pack up

Mode of Delivery

Delivery of this course will be trainer led and delivered over three days of face-to-face training in a classroom setting combined with skills practice and assessment in your simulated work environment.

Clothing Requirement

Learners must wear covered shoes or work boots and hard hat.

Where a learner does not wear covered shoes they will not be able to participate in the course due to work health and safety concerns.

Assessment Summary

The assessment in support of the unit of competency requires the learner to complete written knowledge assessments and then demonstrate their applied knowledge and skills during a practical assessment operating a non-slewing mobile crane, observed by the assessor.

The learner must answer all the written knowledge questions correctly. There is the opportunity for this knowledge assessment to be conducted verbally if the learner requires this level of support. The practical assessment is conducted under controlled conditions in a simulated workplace. The learner will be briefed on the assessment which will involve identifying hazards, calculating load weights, slinging and moving loads safely and monitoring workplace hazards and communicating with others in the workplace.

It is important to note that following the completion of the competency assessment, the learner will return on day three of the course where they will have the opportunity to complete the high risk Licence to operate a non slewing mobile crane (greater than 3 tonnes capacity).

National recognition

On successfully completing the training and assessment you will be issued a Statement of Attainment issuing you the unit of competency: TLILIC0040 Licence to operate a non-slewing mobile crane (greater than 3 tonnes capacity)

This unit of competence is nationally recognised and provides individuals with a valuable outcome that is recognised throughout Australia.

The issuance of the unit of competency will provide you an important part of the eligibility criteria to obtain a Non-slewing mobile crane (class CN) High Risk Work Licence license. Please refer to the section “Non-Slewing Mobile Crane with Work Safe Tasmania” for more information of the licensing process.

Course Materials

Learner training is supported through the provision of quality learning materials and resources. Learners should attend the course in comfortable appropriate work clothing with steel capped boots. All equipment and consumables are supplied as part of the course.

Pre-Requisites/Entry Requirements

Halo Nation Training do require learners to meet the following local entry requirements:

- A current National High-Risk Work Licence (HRWL) or a certification for a specific VET course for HRWL to perform dogging.
- Maths is a major part of the theory component and a sound understanding is essential to be able to complete this training.
- Learners must be aged 18 years or older.
- Photo Identification is required to be sighted prior to course commencement
- Language, literacy and numeracy skills required to interpret work instructions, equipment operating instructions.
- Learners must be dressed in their normal work clothing and be wearing steel capped boots.
- Learners must be alert and physically capable of driving safely.

Responsibility for Training

Halo Nation Training is responsible under the National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011 for the quality of the training and assessment being delivered in this course and for the issuance of all AQF certificates.

EWP licencing with Work Safe Tasmania

You need a high-risk work licence if you want to operate a non-slewing mobile crane greater than 3 tonnes capacity in Tasmania.

The training and assessment delivered in this course only relates to the high-risk work licence **class CN**.

Eligibility criteria for a non-slewing mobile crane licence with Work Safe Tasmania

To obtain a non-slewing mobile crane licence with Work Safe Tasmania, you will need to present Work Safe Tasmania with evidence that you:

- At least 18 years of age.
- Have completed a recognised training course with a registered training organisation (RTO) and have been assessed as competent by an assessor working for the RTO.
- You will also need to bring with you a passport sized and quality photo of yourself with your name and date of birth printed on the back.
- You should note that a licence fee **will** apply to your application for a high-risk work licence. This fee is **not** covered within the course enrolment fee. The application fee is outlined in the Work Safe Tasmania website.
- Can use English at a level that enables the safe performance of high risk work.

Steps to obtain a non-slewing mobile crane licence with Work Safe Tasmania

Once you have completed this course, it will be up to you to apply for your high-risk work licence for non-slewing mobile crane.

The following steps apply to obtain a new non-slewing mobile crane licence with Work Safe Tasmania:

- Have completed the pre-requisites/s.
- Select an approved RTO that delivers the unit of competency TLILIC0040 Licence to operate a non-slewing mobile crane (greater than 3 tonnes capacity)
- Enrol with the RTO and complete the competency-based training and assessment for the unit of competency TLILIC0040 Licence to operate a non-slewing mobile crane (greater than 3 tonnes capacity) and pay the required enrolment fee.
- Complete the mandated high-risk work assessment with an approved high-risk work assessor for licence class CN. This high-risk work assessment will be facilitated by Halo Nation Training as part of the Three-day delivery.
- When you have been assessed as competent in the unit of competency and have passed the high-risk work assessment, the assessor will have the application forms you need to apply for your licence.
- You should then complete the application forms and take these forms to your nearest Service Tasmania Centre as well as 100 points of ID.
